

# **Temporary Food Establishments**

# Policy and Permit Requirements

The following temporary food establishment policy and guidelines are used to determine if food may be served at an event.

- 1. All applicants who would like to prepare food at a temporary event must first make application to the Special Event Committee.
- 2. Upon review by the Special Event Committee it will be determined if food service will be allowed.

Temporary food establishment permits are granted for Special Events. Refer to (Ordinance # 666-1-93).

#### **Allowable Events:**

Temporary food service events are:

• Parades, fairs, festivals, exhibits, block parties, street dances, carnivals, circuses, temporary commercial out-door amusements and sporting events.

## **Temporary Food Establishments May Include:**

One (I) grand opening event, or a charity sponsored function, or a U.S. nationally observed holiday. An additional three (3) events may be included throughout the year for a total of six (6) temporary food service events.

City Sanctioned events are exempt.

## **Time Period Between Uses:**

No permit will be issued before 60 days has passed between each event.

#### Location:

A location may not have more than six (6) temporary food establishment events per year.

## **Applicant:**

An applicant will not be issued more than six (6) temporary establishment food vendor permits per year.
