

Disaster Preparedness Memory Game

Kids: With the help of an adult, cut out the pictures on the next page. Turn them over, and try to match pairs.

Each of the pictures is something you should have in a disaster supply kit!

- Flashlight: To help you see if the power goes out. Don't forget extra batteries!
- Whistle: So you can call for help if you are stuck somewhere.
- Extra Batteries: You will need these for your flashlight and radio.
- Cash: You should keep some cash on hand at all times in case you can't get to an ATM machine.
- **Tools:** In case you need to turn off the water or gas at your home.
- **Medications:** You should have a list of the medicine you take on a regular basis and keep extra medicine in your kit in case you can't get to a pharmacy.
- Activities: You should have a few games, coloring books, etc. in your kit to give you something to do in case there is no power or you have to go to a shelter.
- **First-Aid Kit:** A first-aid kit will come in handy if someone has minor scratches or scrapes, has a headache, or gets bit by a bug!
- **Pet Supplies:** Don't forget about your pets! They need food, water, medicine, leashes, and vaccination paperwork.
- Manual Can Opener: If there is no electricity, you will need this to open the canned food in your kit.
- Bottled Water: You should keep 1 gallon per person per day!
- Non-perishable Food: This includes canned food that does not require cooking or heating to eat.
- **Battery-Operated Radio:** So you can get information about what is going on during a disaster. You may not have power to watch T.V. or listen to a home stereo. Don't forget extra batteries.
- **Important Documents:** You should always keep a copy of important documents in your kit such as, insurance paperwork, birth certificates, lists of medications, will, etc.
